Improved Access - Evening & Weekend Appointments

Patients across Mid Devon are now able to make routine appointments at a GP practice during evenings and at weekends.

The aim of the GP service is to make it easier for people to get an appointment at a time that suits them.

This scheme is an extension of the usual GP practice services, not a walk-in service; patients still need to make an appointment to see a GP, Nurse or Health Care Assistant in the evening or at the weekend.

Practices are working together to establish a service that meets the needs of the public and GP practices will be promoting the service to patients.

Screening Programmes



Bowel Cancer Screening is available for those aged between 60 and 74, you will be invited to take part in bowel cancer screening every two years. If you are aged 75 or over, you can ask for a screening test by calling the free bowel cancer screening helpline on 0800 707 60 60.



Cervical Screening is offered to women aged 25 to 64. Cervical cancer is preventable. The impact of a cervical cancer diagnosis is far reaching both emotionally and physically. Book your smear appointment now, telephone 01769 580295.

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screening (AAA Screening) is offered to men who are in their 65th year.



Diabetic Retinal Eye Screening is offered to diabetics who are 12 years of age or over and will be invited to have their eyes screened once a year.
